



2026/2027 TN School Update

Each year, states may require certain information to be distributed to enrolled families of private schools. HLA is complying with TN state requirements to provide information regarding immunizations as well as the truancy initiatives that are currently in place. *****This update is for INFORMATIONAL PURPOSES ONLY and does not require any action on your part.*** HLA students are not required to provide proof of immunizations.**

Per T.C.A. § 49-50-802 which requires non-public schools to provide parents with information about meningococcal and influenza diseases and the potential effectiveness of vaccinations.

Per T.C.A. § 49-6-3007 (c) It is the duty of the principal or head of school of a public, nonpublic, or church-related school to report in writing to the director of schools of the system in which the school is located the names, ages, and residences of all students in attendance at their schools and classes within thirty (30) days after the beginning of the school year. The principal or head of school of a public, nonpublic, or church-related school must make other reports of attendance in the school, including transfers of students, as may be required by the local board of education, the state board of education, or the department of education. Notwithstanding subsection (f), this subsection applies to any student less than six (6) years of age who is enrolled in kindergarten in any school to which this subsection is applicable.

Per T.C.A. § 49-6-3007 (e)(1) which requires that by the beginning of each school year, the principal or head of school of a public, nonpublic, or church-related school, shall

give written notice to the parent, guardian, or person having control of a student subject to compulsory attendance, that the parent, guardian, or other person having control of the student must monitor the student's school attendance and require the student to attend school. The written notice must inform the parent, guardian, or other person having control of a student that a student who accumulates five (5) days of unexcused absences during the school year is subject to the LEA's progressive truancy interventions and that continued unexcused absences may result in a referral to juvenile court. The five (5) days of unexcused absences need not be five (5) consecutive days of unexcused absences.

As a homeschooler, you are not bound by the public school schedule and therefore have 365 days of the year to complete 180 days of instruction beginning August 1 and ending July 31. Unexcused absences should be rare.

It is always our recommendation to keep good documentation and attendance records are required to be kept. If your student is missing days of school due to medical issues and will not be able to meet the 180 days of attendance in the full school year, please contact us so that we can update your account and put documentation on file. In the case of unexcused absences (see paragraph above), HLA will work only within Tier 1 (see Truancy Intervention link above) which allows for up to five (5) unexcused absences before intervention is required. Unexcused absences of 6 or more will be grounds for dismissal.
